Throughout her distinguished career, Mary has served in pivotal leadership roles including Past President of both the Maryland Association of Public Library Administrators and the Maryland Library Association. In 2018, she was honored with the Maryland Library Association "Outstanding Member" Award, not only for her influence on library development and funding, but also for her role as a mentor and role model to professionals across the state.
