And this little cow does nothing,


[hold up another finger]





Try a Fun Activity Materials:

Painting with Feathers



- Paint palettes (small paper plates)
- Tempera Paints (variety of colors)
- Feathers (from a craft store)
- **Paper**
- 1. Give each child a small paper plate with several colors of paint
- 2. Give each child a feather and a piece of paper
- 3. Encourage the children to paint with the feathers, and enjoy how the colors swirl and mix together

There are five key practices that, combined with family involvement, provide strong support in preparing young children to read.

- Talking: Talking with children helps them learn oral language, one of the most critical early literacy skills. Children learn about language by listening to parents talk and joining in the conversation.
- *Singing*: Singing slows down language so children can hear the different sounds in words, which helps children learn new words and information.
- Reading: Reading together develops vocabulary and comprehension, nurtures a love for reading, and motivates children to want to learn to read.
- Writing: Children become aware that printed letters stand for spoken words as they see print used in their daily lives.
- Playing: Play is one of the best ways for children to learn language and literacy skills. They learn about language through playing as the activities help them put thoughts into words and talk about what they are doing.
