I'm driving very slow.


The light has turned to red,

# Try a Fun Activity

#### Wheel Painting

#### Materials:

- Paper Plates
- Paint (various colors)
- **Toy Cars**
- Paper



#### Directions:

- 1. Squeeze different colored paint onto different paper plates
- 2. Encourage children to "drive" the cars through the paint, and then make wheel tracks on the paper.

Look for examples of wheels, in pictures and in the environment, as you go through your day. Invite children to count wheels, to compare the sizes of wheels, and to describe where they see the wheels or what the wheels are doing (spinning fast or slow).

As children see all of the different places that wheels are used you can support their expanding vocabulary with names and descriptive words. Encourage children to repeat the words and phrases that you use to describe wheels and what wheels do.
